What must be the first step in becoming a disciple?

In this section we will look at just a few examples of people who have become disciples. Look for the common incident in their lives that made them disciples of Jesus.

When we truly meet Jesus and accept the salvation that only He offers we become His disciples. Telling others about Him is easy!

What is the Bible's definition of witnessing?

5. Notice what Jesus says to Nicodemus pertaining to witnessing. John 3:11

Christ is telling the Pharisee that the Jews have both seen and heard, but have not believed. Our witnessing is not to force people to receive. Our part is to witness by telling others what we have seen and heard.

6. Now go to John 3:32 dealing with John the Baptizer's account of Jesus.

That must have been discouraging but he kept on. True witnessing does not have to be giving Bible studies. That is included but true witnessing is simply telling people what Christ means to you. If Jesus is not peace and hope to you what are you going to witness about? When people see the joy, the peace, the hope in spite of problems that you might have, you are witnessing.

7. There is a very important caution to our witnessing. Pilate asked Jesus if he was a king. Let's let Jesus' words to Pilate help with this caution. John 18:37

Be very careful to only witness the truth. We have to bear witness to the truth about God, about Jesus, about sin and about salvation. Don't become one of the false Christs or false prophets that Jesus talked about (Matthew 24:24).

8. We must remember our job description. Our job is witnessing and whether we witness and win no souls is not our problem. Luke 9:22 saying, "The Son of Man must suffer many things, and be ______ by the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and be raised the third day."
Can you imagine Jesus, the greatest Witness and yet they rejected Him and His message. So don't feel that you are a failure if people don't accept what you have witnessed. Jesus knows the right time and He will come back to those people.



For almost a half year I gave Bible studies to Emma whose husband had abandoned her and their new born baby girl. After completing 21 out of the 23 lessons she suddenly moved and I lost all contact with her. I was sick about this and felt that I had failed. A few years later I ran into her mother and inquired about my former student. Her mother told me that she had

remarried and that both her and her husband had been baptized. I was shocked and wanted to know how that happened. I was told that one evening her new husband asked about the Sabbath and Emma remembered that she still had the lessons that we had studied. Emma and her husband began to study those lessons. Later they found a Seventh-day Adventist pastor and took more studies and were baptized. Later on I was visiting the Tampa First SDA Church. A young woman came up to me and asked if I remembered her. It was Emma and I was visiting the church of their membership. Jesus knows the right time and He will come back to those people.

9.	Knowing what we should be doing is not a problem because Jesus gave us our commission. Matthew 28:19-20 NKJV
	"Go therefore and of all the nations, in the name of the Father
	and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, to observe all things that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, <i>even</i> to the end of the age." Amen.
	In our commission Jesus gave three steps. We must not get these out of order. Here are the three
	steps:
	#1: Make disciples. A disciple is someone who follows a master or teacher. We must first bring people to Jesus and ask them to follow Him.
	#2: The next step is baptize them (lesson #7).
	#3: Then you teach them to observe all things that Jesus commands. The point here is that before they can accept Jesus' teachings, they must first experience and develop an eternal relationship with Jesus. Having taken this step they will gladly accept the Bible's teachings and become witnesses to make more disciples.
10.	Witnessing for Jesus can be costly. What can we expect as we witness? Matthew 5:11-12 NKJV "Blessed are you when they and you, and say all kinds of evil against you falsely for My sake. Rejoice and be exceedingly glad, for great <i>is</i> your , for so they persecuted the prophets who were before you."
	When you accept Jesus' Gospel Commission and "go" you are invading the devil's territory. This means you have joined the great controversy but now you are on God's side. Don't expect Satan to leave you alone. The persecution can come physically, mentally, or socially. Jesus told His disciples to count the cost (Luke 14:26-33).

Four easy steps to becoming a disciple
